Two weeks ago the senior Enviro extension group planted 90 native trees in the area surrounding the bottom field and playground, our effluent dispersement field. We worked in pairs and planted replacement trees in areas where there was a gap. We started by taking the plants out of the growing bags and then we dug holes for the plants, after we planted them we watered them with worm

tea and water. If you would like to have look at them, you are welcome to go ahead and take a look but please do not cross the fence.

On behalf of our school we would like to say a big thank you to Hawke's Bay Regional Council for granting our school a \$500 LEAF (Local Environmental Action Fund) grant to go towards the native plants.
