



Health Curriculum Delivery Statement: Thank you to all who responded to the survey around the Health Curriculum. We have used your feedback alongside guidance from the New Zealand Health Curriculum to develop the following two-year plan. This has been approved by the Board of Trustees and is now in place.

Eskdale School Health Curriculum Delivery Statement

The following statement has been developed after carrying out consultation with the school community to determine the health education priorities for Eskdale School Students. The delivery of the programme and its content was also discussed.

'Eskdale School will follow a two year programme as set out below to cover the Health Curriculum.'

NE-Year 2

Odd Year- Beach Education, Bounce Back Programme (Wellbeing, Resilience, Confidence, Courage and Bullying), and Keeping Ourselves Safe.

Even Year- Firewise, and Bounce Back (As above)

Year 3-4

Odd Year- Road Safety, Bounce Back Programme (Building on skills developed in year 1 & 2), and Keeping Ourselves Safe.

Even Year- Healthy Living (Dental Health & Nutrition), Bounce Back Programme (Building on skills developed in year 1 & 2)

Year 5-6

Odd Year- Beach Education, Kia Kaha (Anti Bullying programme).

Even Year- Healthy Living and lifestyles

In both odd and even years, year 6 students will also cover an introduction to Positive Puberty and Year 5 students will cover mental health and well-being

Year 7-8

Odd Year - DARE (Drug abuse resistance education), Keeping ourselves safe.

Even Year- Firewise, Sexuality Road Programme (Building on from the positive puberty programme)

In both odd and even year's students in Year 8 will undertake the Skills for Success programme and the Year 7 students will cover a mental health and wellbeing unit.

Prior to all health units commencing an outline of content will be shared with parents. DARE, Positive Puberty, Sexuality Road and Keeping Ourselves safe will also include a parent information meeting.

As a school we believe that the classroom teacher is the key person in delivering the health programme. We will utilise all resources available to us and work in conjunction with other professionals (e.g. Public Health Nurse, Police) when appropriate.

School Cross Country: The school cross country was held on Tuesday and that Eskdale 'never give up' attitude was on display from all of our children. It was an awesome day with perfect running conditions for a cross country. The conditions were also perfect for our spectators and it was awesome to see so much support from our families. It was great to see our older students encouraging and supporting the younger children as they ploughed through the mud and water during their run. A big thank you to Mr Woods for creating a fun and challenging track for our children to enjoy. Congratulations to all runners on completing the course and a special congrats to the place getters below.










Robotics and Coding: Last week we introduced robotics and coding to the students at school. Each class will work through 6-7 sessions of the coding and robotics. This is being led by Mrs Gillespie and the classroom teachers are learning alongside the students. The first class to get started was Toroa and the students were very excited and engaged in their first session. The robotics and coding provide an excellent context for the children to develop their problem solving skills and their logical thinking skills.



There is no doubt these skills will be essential for our students in the future.


