A 2nd Community Resilience Workshop is being held on **Saturday 29th October, meeting at 12.45 at Petane Marae, Tait Rd, Whirinaki**. Everyone who has a connection with Bay View, Eskdale, Tangoio and Whirinaki is encouraged to attend to learn more about our earthquake and tsunami risks.



A scientist will be presenting information about 8000 years of earthquake and tsunami evidence with time to ask questions about the research being done in Ahuriri and Tangoio.

Bring the children; there will be plenty for them to do, including a tsunami demo tank to play with.

At this workshop a Tsunami Walk for our coastal community will be organised to prepare for evacuating, with our inland community giving thought to how they might help. We look forward to seeing you there.
