 Bay. Each division had over thirty teams competing and we entered two teams in the year 7 competition and two teams in the year 8 competition. Both competitions followed the same format with an individual section, a problem solving question, and a rip and run-rapid problem solving section. The points from the three sections were combined to find the overall placings. Our two year 7 teams (Joel, Quillan, Louis and Elise, Tukara and Jamie) competed first with both teams finishing with credible results and finishing in the top half of their competition. Then came the turn of the year 8's. Our two year 8 teams achieved outstanding results with team two (Tess, Tia and Kelsie) finishing in fifth place and team one (Josiah, Leah, and Ethan) taking out the gold medal and winning the Hawkes
 Bay Mathletics competition. This is the first time Eskdale School has been able to etch our name onto the trophy. Congratulations to all of our students who competed on the night and well done to Mr Jones your extra maths coaching paid off!

Hawkes Bay Arts festival: On 24th of September, 18 of our year 7 \& 8 students (aka Glee Club), got the opportunity to perform in the Hawke's Bay Youth Festival of Arts.
