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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome to our June newsletter. This year is certainly a year like no other one we have ever experienced. It seems a long time since our last newsletter back in March. Since then we have had 90 students manage to squeeze in a school camp, 50 complete the Optimist Yachting and everyone experience a nationwide lockdown. It is great to have everyone back on deck and have that sense of normality restored. Everyone's lockdown looked different but the children have adjusted well to life back at school and are getting on with their learning.

Parent Conferences: We have our mid-year learning conferences coming up on Monday, 29 June 2020 and Tuesday, 30 June 2020. This will be an opportunity to discuss your child's progress across the curriculum including how they are developing the Eskdale Learning attributes. It will also provide time to talk through what you noticed about your child while they were learning remotely.

School will finish at 12.30pm for interviews on Monday, 29 June 2020 and buses will run at this time. School will finish at the normal time of 2.45pm on Tuesday, 30 June 2020. Bookings for interviews and details of how to book online for an interview will be available from Monday, 15 June 2020.

New Playground equipment: We have installed additional playground equipment to the bottom field and the students have certainly been making the most of it! Thank you to the PTA for purchasing the new equipment, Brendan Berkett for getting the holes sorted and Lance our hardworking Caretaker for getting it all installed for the students to enjoy. Over time we look forward to adding more equipment to this area.





End of School Day: We know that parking at the end of the school day can be a challenge and somewhat chaotic on occasions. The long-term solution to this problem is providing additional car parking on the school grounds and this is planned as part of a major upcoming capital works project for our school.

In the interim to manage the Health and Safety risks for our students we are going to put in place an early finish for our New Entrant, Year 1 and Year 2 students. The new finish time of 2.30pm will begin in Term 3

and will involve Kotare, Weka, Korimako and Tui classes. We are working through a plan to ensure the transition to the earlier finish time works smoothly and effectively. We will also be making sure we have systems in place to cater for the diverse needs of the children involved including those students with older siblings or those students that catch one of the school buses. This is just an initial heads-up and as we finalise the plan, further communication will come out to the families in Kotare, Weka, Korimako and Tui classes before the end of this term.

School Photos: The Class and individual photos are set for Wednesday, 10 June 2020. At this stage most of you do not need to do anything as you will be able to view and order the photos online once they have been completed. If however you have got more than one child at school and would like a sibling photo please complete the sibling photo form in the office before next Wednesday.

School Fees/Donations: Thank you to those who have already paid these. We have been able to keep the recommended school fees/donation at the same amount again this year - \$35.00 per term. These form an integral part of ensuring we can provide all of the resources we want to for our students. The funds provided by the Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are essential for every child to experience success. Over the past 12 months we have used the school donations for increased teachers in classes (reducing teacher to student ratio), increased reading recovery time and bought some additional robotics, science and technology resources.

2020 Recommended School Fee/Donation: \$35.00 per term or

- Individual Child \$140.00 per year discounted if paid before the end of Term 2 to \$120.00.
- Two Children \$280.00 per year discounted if paid before the end of Term 2 to \$240.00.
- Three or more children \$420.00 per year discounted if paid before the end of Term 2 to \$360.00.


Thank you for all of your support throughout the lockdown period and in the process of transitioning everyone back to school.


Hauora is a Māori philosophy of health and well-being, unique to New Zealand. There are four dimensions of Hauora; Taha Tinana (Physical Well-being - health), Taha Hinengaro (Mental and Emotional well-being - self-confidence), Taha Whanau (Social Wellbeing - self-esteem) and Taha Wairua (Spiritual well-being personal beliefs) There is physical, emotional/mental, social and spiritual caring. The Whare Tapa Wha model represents aspects of Hauora as the four walls of a whare, each wall representing a different dimension. All four dimensions are necessary for strength and stability. This is a great way to cater for the well-being of our students.

A BIG CONGRATULATIONS to our two winning families this year, each selling over \$280 worth of bulbs!!


