
Principal's Report

School Fees/Donations: We have had an excellent response to the school fee/family donation this year- Thank you. If you haven't paid these yet, we would appreciate having these before the end of the year. These funds make a real difference to what we can do at school for our learners. The funds provided by the Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are essential for every child to experience success. Over the past 12 months we have used the school donations for increased teachers in classes (reducing teacher to student ratio), increased reading recovery time and bought some additional robotics, science, and technology resources.

Wakely Shield During the school holidays Jasper Robertson, Tom Stilwell, Kobe Simmonds, and Lachie Harkness played in the Wakely Shield Rugby Tournament for Napier West.

We also had Liam Kaye and Noah Kyle playing in the same tournament for the Napier Saracens Team.

There were eight teams from all over Hawkes Bay competing for the shield. They were from Napier East/West/Saracens, Hastings East/West/Barbarians, Wairoa, and Central Hawkes Bay.

Napier West lost to Hastings West earlier in the week during pool play but came back to meet them in the final.

In the first half of the final, Napier West was down 10-0 to Hastings West, but Napier knew they were still in the fight, and came back strong in the second half to win 19-10.

There are three policies under review this term: *Harassment*, which is under consideration by the board and staff, as well as *Maori Education Success* and *Religious Education*, both of which are open to feedback from parents and caregivers.
