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Principal's Report

Welcome to the first newsletter of Term 2. We have had an excellent start to the term, and it is great being able to look forward to once again participating in all the different activities and sports our children enjoy being involved in. On Thursday last week we had our first whole school assembly for this year and in fact for quite some time. It is always nice to be able to gather as a whole school and we look forward to having greater connection with the wider community now that most of the covid restrictions have lifted.

Student Engagement: As things have settled back to relative normal it is great to see high levels of engagement from our learners across the school. The students are enjoying not having to wear a mask in class and making the most of their learning across the full breadth of the curriculum. The importance of things like the Basic Facts in Maths should however never be overlooked and these continue to be a focus across our school. We need all students to develop automaticity with the Basic Facts so that they can answer them without even having to think about them. Much in the same way we can walk without thinking about how we take each step. These building blocks ensure that when students are faced with more challenging word problems, they can focus on answering what the question is asking not working out the mechanics of 7 x 4.

Rippa Rugby Tournament: On Monday 9 May, 50 Year 3 - 6 students took part in a Rippa Rugby Tournament against other Hawkes Bay schools. It was a fun day out especially as there hasn't been many sports events in the past few years. The weather was great and it was awesome being outside! We really enjoyed going for a run around and being with our friends.

Building update: You will have all seen the new temporary classrooms on the top field and the work underway on the new carpark. Based on the current timeline we are hoping to have the temporary classrooms ready to move in to by the middle of June. Kotare, Korimako, Tui and Kea classes will make the transition prior to the end of this term so that demolition of the old block can commence in the July school holidays. The carpark is due to be completed before the end of this term and in full use by the beginning of Term 3. We do know that these timelines are somewhat fluid as there are a number of variables that can cause delays however it is exciting to see the progress and the plans finally coming together.

School Fees/Donations: Firstly, I would like to thank everyone who has already paid these this year. The school fees/donations for 2022 are set at \$40.00 per term. These form an integral part of ensuring we can provide all of the resources we want for our students. The funds provided by the

Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are essential for every child to experience success. Over the past 12 months we have used the school donations for increased teachers in classes (reducing teacher to student ratio), increased reading recovery time and bought some additional devices, robotics, science, and technology resources.

2022 Recommended School Fee/Donation: \$40.00 per term or

- Individual Child \$160.00 per year discounted if paid in Term 1 to \$140.00.
- Two Children \$320.00 per year discounted if paid in Term 1 to \$280.00.
- Three or more children \$480.00 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$420.00.

Online Safety- May Focus - Sharing Images Safely, Digital Footprints and Sharenting

Social media makes it easy to share photos of your children with friends and family over the road and around the world. If you're thinking about sharing a photo of your child online Netsafe has some tips about how to do so safely:

1. Look ahead

It's worth taking some time to think about the digital footprint you are creating for your child by posting images or other content about them online. Think about how your child might feel about the content you're sharing once they're older and how it may affect their future.

2. Ask for permission

Does the photo you're about to post include other people's children? It's best if you ask their parents for permission before you post a photo online. If your children are old enough consider asking them if they're ok for you to share it before you post a photo as well.

3. Check your privacy settings

If you're thinking about sharing a photo of your child on social media it's important that you first check what privacy settings you have set up. Some social media networks default to public or more open privacy settings when you sign up so make sure what you're posting can only be seen by the people you'd like to see it.

4. Think about who you've got in your friend network

A lot of people have social media networks that include people they aren't close to anymore. Make sure you are happy with everyone in your social media friend network seeing the photo - if you're not sure or if you'd prefer to share it only with a smaller group consider setting up a private social network group with friends and family or a group chat.

5. Is there any personal information in the picture?

Before you hit post, have another close look at the photo to make sure you're not revealing any personal information about yourself or your child. Some things to look out for include: the name of your child's school, your road or house number or any other personal or private information.
