Principal's Report

Welcome to the August School Newsletter. It has been great seeing the progress both with the school building projects and with the way the children are getting stuck into their learning. The four classes that have moved to the temporary rooms have settled quickly into their new spaces and it now looks like they have been there all year. This term is a busy one with a wide variety of activities going on for the students, from sports to edible arts through to classes visiting the Science Roadshow, Jump Jam Competition and children competing in the Hawkes Bay Lit guiz or Mathletics. It is always positive to see our students embracing the different opportunities on offer.

Learning, Achievement and Attendance: As a team we have reviewed progress of all learners across the school, and we are pleased with the progress the children are making in the core areas of numeracy and literacy. I am pleased to share that the



schoolwide achievement levels for 2022 are similar to previous years. As we dig deeper into the results we can see that there is a direct correlation between attendance and achievement. We know that illness has played its part this year with students' attendance however we can also see that in general, students who have missed a disproportionate number of school days are not meeting their learning milestones. To put it simply we need students at school, in class, so that they can reach their learning milestones and achieve to their full potential.

Cross Country: The training is well and truly underway for the School Cross Country. Given the weather of recent times we have a course that is very wet and muddy this year. The course is set up using the school and neighbouring property. We have set times for each of the races so that you can plan your day and the children can continue their learning when they aren't running. Rugby: Earlier this term Puketapu School challenged our Year 5/6 students to a rugby game to help them prepare for their Spooner Shield Tournament. On August 3rd Puketapu came over to Eskdale for the game. Eskdale ended up winning 6-1. Puketapu challenged Eskdale to a rematch and this took place at Puketapu School on Wednesday 17th August. After a hard-fought match, Eskdale again came out victorious, winning 2-1. Huge congratulations to all the team who played their hearts out in both games!



Playground: The new playground pictured below is now up and running and I know the students love it. This was partly funded by the Ministry of Education with the balance of the funds coming from the Eskdale Board of Trustees. The new playground is open to all children but more targeted towards our senior school students and is proving to be the right level of challenge. It is also removing the congestion of students in the old playground area.

Asbestos removal: Over the upcoming weekend more of the asbestos cladding will be removed from the old school block. Please see details below and stay out of the school grounds over the weekend.

Notice of Asbestos Removal Work

To Whom It May Concern,

A Minus Limited is a licensed Asbestos Removalist (WorkSafe Class B licence: number RB16090145) will be undertaking removal work of some Asbestos Containing Materials (ACMs) from Eskdale School, Classroom Blocks A, B, E & L.

This removal work will be conducted between the hours of 7.30am to 5.00pm on 20th August and is expected to finish on 21st August. This work may need to be re-scheduled in the event of bad weather.

WorkSafe NZ was notified on 16/06/22 that this licensed asbestos removal work is to be undertaken.

Eskdale School management and board of trustees have been consulted about the nature and timing of this work, together with the safety measures to be used.

The following safety measures will be put in place and maintained for the duration of this project:

- Signs, barriers and/or temporary fencing will be installed.
- PVA solution or water will be applied to asbestos containing materials to prevent airborne asbestos fibres dust (as required).
- Asbestos containing materials will not be broken, where possible.
- Plastic will be used to cover horizontal surfaces and surrounds.
- Asbestos containing material will be wrapped on site and disposed of at an approved tip site.
- Air monitoring at the work site boundary will be in place for the duration of the work. If asbestos
 fibres above the allowable safe limit are detected, work will cease immediately and corrective
 measures applied.
- An independent party will carry out an inspection of the site on completion of the work, and issue a clearance certificate.

Online Safety Message - Making an Online Safety Plan

One of the best ways to keep your children safe online is to make a plan about what you'd both do if something was to go wrong. It's important that you and your child make this plan together, so that both of you understand what to do if something goes wrong or they need help.

To get started read our five steps, download the Netsafe Family Safe Online Treaty and then sit down with the family to agree on what your family will do.

1. Figure out what they know already: The best place to start the conversation is by figuring out what your child knows already. Talk to them about issues they've seen happen to friends or at school and use this as a basis for your discussions with them. Use these discussions as the starting point for the plan you develop together.

2. Let them know that you will support them no matter what: Research shows that many young people feel they would rather speak to a friend than a parent or other trusted adult for fear of being judged. It's important to let them know that they can talk to you about anything and that you will be there to support them no matter what.

3. Talk about who they can reach out to if they need help: If something does go wrong online it's important that your child speaks to someone about it. Discuss who might be appropriate for them to speak to if they need help. This could be you, a close friend, a trusted family member, a teacher or a support service such as Netsafe.

4. Discuss ways to report or remove harmful content: Most social media sites have a 'report' function to allow people to report content that is in violation of their terms of service. Make sure your child knows how to block someone, report content and how to use their privacy settings. If you or your child need help removing harmful content online you can contact Netsafe for help. Netsafe can offer help for all situations – big or small.

5. Have emergency contact details on hand in case you need it: In case of an urgent situation it's worth having an understanding of what services are available and when you should contact them just in case. Netsafe has a comprehensive list available at <u>netsafe.org.nz/make-a-plan</u>
