Report Survey: This year we have moved away from the old-style written report to a new more frequent up to date reporting system via SeeSaw. This, in conjunction with our parent/teacher conferences has been developed to keep parents more up to date with their child's progress throughout the year in relation to the curriculum. It has also allowed us to share evidence of students work to support the reports. We would like to hear your feedback on these and will be sharing a short survey next week that we would like you to complete.

School Caretaker/Groundsman: Our superstar caretaker and grounds person Ginny is finishing up at the end of the year. If you would like to know more about this 27.5 hour per week part-time role, please contact me directly. We are wanting to get this position filled over the next couple of weeks.

Hawkes Bay Mathletics: At the end of last term we had four teams compete in the Hawkes Bay Mathletics Competition in Hastings where the best math brains from around the Bay came together to compete - a bit like the Olympics of Math. The competition is spread over three grueling stages to find the overall team champions in Year 7 and Year 8 and an individual champion in each division. In total there were over 30 schools competing.

In the Year 7 competition the team consisting of Micah Longdon, Liam Hellyer and Akio Crofsky took out first place and Evie Kersley, Yoshi Bowcock and Grace Sung took out second place. In the Year 8 competition the team of Sadie Bond, Amelia Roborgh and Gabriella Brownlie took out fourth place and the team of Isaac Bennett, Lola Brown, and Locky Harris took out 13th place. I am super proud of these students who trained hard for the event and reaped the rewards for the hard work on the night. Along with the certificates both Year 7 teams came away with some winners cash! Micah Longdon also took out the individual competition for Year 7 students.

Cross Country Events: With the school cross country event out of the way we had large groups of student's head to the Napier and District's School Cross Country and many also then went on to compete in the Hawkes Bay Cross Country. It was so pleasing to see the guts and determination displayed on the track by our students and then the way they supported their teammates as they competed in their races.

- Year 5 Girls: Elia Giacometti 1st and Emily Fisher 5th

In the teams event we managed to finish 3rd in the Year 3 girls race, 4th in the Year 3 boys race, 1st in the Year 4 girls race, 1st in the Year 4 boys race and 1st in the Year 5 girls race. We also finished 3rd in the overall school competition.

The Hawkes Bay Cross country top 10 results were: Isaac Bennett 3rd in the Year 8 boys, Holly Verry 2nd and Frankie Ross 3rd in the Year 4 girls and Elia Giacometti 5th in the Year 5 girls.







Capital works project: The progress with the new classroom block is really positive and as the building starts to take shape, we can begin to get excited about getting into a new modern fit for purpose building facility that our students and teachers deserve. Based on the latest timeline we will be in the building well before the end of next year.



2023 Ross Shield: Two of our boys were selected and played in the tournament. Their recount of the tournament is below.

We played in the 2023 Ross Shield Tournament representing Napier which was held in Napier (Park Island) and it was played in the first week of the school holidays.

For the previous 12 weeks prior to the tournament, we had 41 grueling training sessions with our coaches JR, Tom, Ted and Willie - they definitely weren't afraid to rip into us! At the first training we did more fitness than we ever imagined and to prepare for the big week we had to do two runs one was 16km and the other one was around 12km. As our coach Tom said, "Train hard, play easy" and that was put to work come the tournament.

CHB was our first big clash, they were not to be taken lightly as we didn't want our hopes of the shield to be stolen on the first day. It turns out that we were not to worry as we smoked them 71-0. Our next game was against Dannevirke and the same as the day before, we weren't to take them easy but slayed it and smashed them 56-0. The third day we were up against Hastings East. This was our hardest game yet. They came in confident and then they got humbled and beaten 61-0. On the fourth day we played Wairoa which was the first team to score on us, the score was 82-12. Our last game was against Hastings West. It was so cold it was nearly snowing but we still managed to pull out the win 29-5.

Our team won the shield just like last year's Napier team did. We turned out to be the most dominant team in the history of the tournament, so we are pretty proud and happy about our tournament.
