## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome the first newsletter of Autumn. The first term is now nearly at the halfway point and the students are certainly making the most of the learning opportunities. It was great to see so many of you making it along to the meet the teacher night and the structured literacy information evening.

**Structured literacy:** If you didn't make it along on the night but would like to know more, please chat with your child's teacher or you can follow the link to the presentation that was shared on the information evening. <u>www.eskdale.school.nz</u> The important message is that many aspects of this approach were already part of our programme and moving forward this is now front and centre to our approach when teaching reading and writing. The evidence is unequivocal that this is the best way to learn to read and write including spelling.



**Cyclone Gabrielle anniversary:** A few of our school leaders attended the service at the Eskdale War Memorial Church and as a whole school we took a moment to reflect on the Cyclone and the 12 months that have followed. The focus was on the resilience, sense of community spirit, and the courage shown by so many. It was also positive to remember that it was by working together that we were able to get through. It is hard at times to believe that it was 12 months ago last Friday that we had our first school day at Petane Domain. We continue to think of the people in our community that are still working through the ongoing challenge left from Cyclone Gabrielle.

During the afternoon of the anniversary, we were lucky enough to have a helicopter from No. 3 Squadron drop in for a visit. The students thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to hop on board and check it out this impressive piece of machinery. We appreciated the fact Hastings Boys High School nominated our school for the visit and the generous Koha they delivered on the flight.



**Parent/Teacher Learning conferences:** These are coming up in Week 8 on Monday 25 March and Tuesday 26 March. This term the focus for these conversations will be around how your child has settled into the year, their initial learning strengths observed and areas to further develop. The information you can share about your child is also important as you know them best!

**School Fees/Donations:** We have been able to keep our school fees/donations the same again for the third year running. Our 2024 school fees/donations are set at \$40.00 per term. These form an integral part of ensuring we can provide all the resources we want to for our students. The funds provided by the Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are essential for every child to experience success. Over the past 12 months we have used the school donations for increased teachers in classes (reducing teacher to student ratio), increased literacy support time, increased teacher aide support, and purchased additional learning resources.

2024 Recommended School Fee/Donation: \$40.00 per term or

- Individual Child \$160.00 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$140.00.
- Two Children \$320.00 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$280.00.
- Three or more children \$480.00 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$420.00.

It's been a great start to the 2024 school year. We are now focused on keeping the momentum going into the 2nd half of this term and the rest of the year.
