**Parent/Teacher Learning conferences:** The Parent/Teacher Learning Conferences at the end of last term had an excellent turnout. Over 98% of students had conferences attended by their parents. It is great to be part of a school where parents are engaged in their child/ren's education.

**Attendance:** As shared in the Monday Reminders our Attendance rates last term was the best since Term 1 2020. We know that attendance is closely linked to achievement, so this was a positive way to start 2025. A child is deemed to be attending school regularly if they are at school 90% of the time or over. Last term 78% of our learners were at school for 90% of the time or greater. The target by the government is to have 80% of students attending schools regularly (90% of the time) by 2030 so we are well on track to meet this target. Please keep up the great work in getting your child/ren to school this term and let's see whether we can beat the 78% we hit last term.

**Hawkes Bay Literacy Quiz:** On 4 April, eight of our Eskdale Year 7/8's went to Taradale Intermediate to compete in the annual Lit Quiz Competition. We entered two teams to this event, and in total there were about 34 teams participating.

The event went for three hours, and there were 10 categories with 10 questions in each category. Some of the categories were 'Beards,' 'Greed,' and 'Drinks.' You don't know the categories prior to arriving at the competition.

One of our teams won the 'Greed' category, correctly answering 9/10 questions which saw them win a prize of \$5 each. A big thank you to everyone who helped out to make this event happen, especially Miss Rodda (who went with us on the night and helped us train for this night). **School Fees/Donations:** We have been able to keep our school fees/donations the same again for the fourth year running.

Our 2025 school fees/donations are set at \$40.00 per student per term. These form an integral part of ensuring we can provide all the resources we want to for our students. The funds provided by the Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are essential for every child to experience success.

Over the past 12 months we have used the school donations for increased teachers in classes (reducing teacher to student ratio), increased literacy support time and purchased additional learning resources.

2025 Recommended School Fee/Donation: \$40.00 per term; or

- Individual Child \$160.00 per year discounted if paid in Term 1 to \$140.00.
- Two Children \$320.00 per year discounted if paid in Term 1 to \$280.00.
- Three or more children \$480.00 per year discounted if paid in Term 1 to \$420.00.
