Week 1

Welcome to the 2017 school year. A special welcome to the 31 student's new to Eskdale School this year. 11 of whom had their first ever day at school. Judging by the buzz of students and parents on Tuesday morning everyone has recharged their batteries and are ready to jump into the new school year. The teaching team has been preparing and looking forward to the return of the students and the school certainly came to life on Tuesday. The enthusiasm displayed by the students is infectious and it makes Eskdale School a great place to be!

As a school we continue to grow and we need to continue to evolve with this and the dynamics that it brings. There are a couple of key elements that make a school like ours special and they are our school values and the community/family feel to the school. To ensure we keep these we are continually looking at how we change and adapt the things we are doing. There are some important changes we have made for this year. These along with a few reminders are outlined in this newsletter.


Houses and House system: This year we are introducing two new houses and this means some of the existing houses also need to change colours. We believe a really important aspect of our school culture is having the older students working with and alongside the younger ones (Tuakana-teina). The house system provides an excellent opportunity for this to happen and we want to ensure that the children get to know their big buddy well and that the house leaders know all of the children in their house. This happens best when we limit the number of children in each house and provide regular opportunities for them to get together. Of course for this to happen it has meant that some students have had to change house.

So we now have 6 houses being:

Kauri (White) Rimu (Blue) Kahikatea (Orange) Pohutukawa (Red) Kowhai (Yellow) Totara (Green)

The houses will meet at the end of lunch every Thursday for buddy reading. On odd weeks they will then move to School Assembly and sit in their house groups and on even weeks they will stay in their house group for the afternoon and take part in house activities and competitions. These will be either sporting, cultural, art or music activities. We are hoping that this change will build on and lift the profile of our School Houses.





New Eskdale School sign and Koru's: There was a new school sign (kindly donated by Branded Signs) erected at the end of the last school year along with 5 Koru's. The Koru's were selected by the Enviro squad members to commemorate the school achieving green-gold status. These five Koru's reflect the five school values of care, community, aspiration, respect, and excellence. They also reflect the five Enviro-School guiding principles.

Communication and the school Newsletter: There will be some changes to the newsletter this year. The newsletter will change to a monthly newsletter that will come through <u>both</u> in hard copy and online. The newsletter will include not only information about what is going on at school but will also be a real celebration of student's learning with direct input into the newsletter from the students. Each week on a Monday morning there will be a reminders email come out to remind everyone about what is coming up each week. The new school website will also be a place of more information and updated regularly. We now have 274 people registered with our Parent Teacher Calendar App which provides the school calendar and push notifications when there are changes. This is another way of keeping up to date with the happenings at school. When uploading the app please hit 'yes' for receiving notifications.

On Friday February 17 we will be celebrating Art Deco at school and we are encouraging the students to come along in Art Deco costume. Teachers will discuss costume ideas with their class before the day.

Sunsmart: During term 1 and term 4 hats are compulsory. Please make sure your child has a hat to wear each day at school and that they have sunscreen applied before they come to school.

Upcoming events: Term 1 always has lots on and this year is no different. Please keep an eye on the school calendar with events such as Triathlons, Swimming Sports, and Meet the Teacher evenings.



Family Donation/Fees: For the fourth successive year we have been able to keep The family donation/fees at the same rate. These form an integral part in ensuring we can provide all of the resources we want to for our students. The funds provided by the Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are critical in ensuring every child experiences success. Thank you for your support with this.

School Fee/ Family Donation: (\$30 per child per term) or

- Individual Child \$120 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$100.
- Two Children \$240 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$200.
- Three or more Children \$360 per year discounted if paid in term 1 to \$300.

PTA: The PTA has their first get together of the year on Tuesday 7 February at 7.30pm in the school staffroom. This is a great way that you can be involved in supporting your children at school. It is also an excellent way of getting to know other parents in our school community.

A few reminders:

- School starts at 8.45am. A good start to the day is important for all learners so we
 ask that all children are at school and ready to go by 8.45am. For Health and
 Safety reasons we also ask that children do not arrive before 8.00am.

Education for Sustainability (EFS)

A big thank you to those parents who volunteered to help with watering during the school holidays. Thanks to you, we managed to keep the plants in the Nursery and Propagation House alive; we really appreciate your efforts.

The pupils in Toroa and Hihi will be actively learning in our outdoor settings this term, meeting every Friday from 1.35 – 2.35. We would love some adult assistance with these hands-on sessions, if you have an hour to spare please let the classroom teacher know. We are also very keen to meet anyone who feels they may have skills to share with our pupils.
