Welcome to the May edition of the school Newsletter and the first newsletter of term 2. I hope you all had a break over the holidays and enjoyed some time with your children. The term has started well and it was great being able to welcome our new term 2 families with a Mihi Whakatau on the first day of school. The term ahead is sure to be another action packed one especially with the winter sports codes kicking into gear. This term we have 61 students (6 teams) playing Hockey, 41 students (5 teams) playing Netball, 50 students (6 teams) playing Basketball and Miniball, and over 100 students have put their name down for Gymnastics. Thank you to all of the parents who have volunteered as coaches and manages, and thank you to Kellie Harkness for co-ordinating all of the teams, gear, and uniforms.

Kids Literacy Quiz

I was able to go to the Kids Lit Quiz last term and watch our two teams challenge themselves and do well against all the other Intermediate Schools in Hawkes Bay. Nicole Bewick has written a report below about the event.

'On the 6th of April, two teams from year 7 and 8 went to Napier Intermediate School for the Hawkes Bay Literature Quiz competition. The competition consists of 100 questions under 10 categories. Wayne Mills is the organiser of this event and he writes all the questions for every country that competes. He has never repeated a question and every question is from a book that he has

read. The categories are shared with teams when they arrive and they get to choose one category in which they receive double points. Some of this year's categories were monsters, galaxies, foxes, gems and plants. Wayne calls out the question and you work together in your team to answer. Then you hand them in and they are marked. Last year the teams started training for the Lit Quiz. Rebecca Maidment (one of the team member's parents) has kindly been coming in on a Friday before school to train and prepare the teams. Out of the 100 questions, the mixed year 7/8 team (Kitty, Tess, Harris, Keta) got 68.5 points and the year 8 team (Nicole, Joe, Fraser, Caspian) got 74 points. The Year 8 team ended up winning the Hawke's Bay competition by 1 point with 3 teams tying for second and our Year 7 & 8 team finishing 5th equal. The winning regional teams from around NZ will be going to Wellington on the 10th of June to compete in the National finals. The winning team then goes to the world finals; this year being held in Auckland. Teams from around the world compete for the Lit Quiz cup. Wayne Mills created the event so that people who liked reading had a way of being recognised and could talk with other people who liked reading. All of the Eskdale kids who attend really enjoyed the event and will certainly keep reading and discussing their reads to prepare for the National final.'









Reports and Interviews

School reports will be coming home at the end of week 8 and interviews will be held at the beginning of week 9(Monday 25 and Tuesday 26 June). The mid-year reports will look very similar to those received in the middle of last year with a visual graphic to show progress and teacher comments on reading, writing and maths. The interviews this year will again provide the opportunity for teachers and parents to discuss all those other important aspects to the curriculum along with the different learning dispositions and behaviours modelled by their child.

With the removal of National Standards and the ever-changing dynamics of learning in the 21st century, we want to revisit and review our reporting moving forward. We want your thoughts about what you value in a report and we want your input. We will be sending home a survey with the next newsletter to get your thoughts about school reports.

PALs Last term I had the privilege of taking our 18 House and Deputy House Leaders to the PALs training day. Below is what three of the boys thought of the day.

At the end of term 1 all the year 8 house leaders and deputy house leaders went to PALs training (**P**hysical **A**ctivities Leadership training) at Pettigrew Green Arena in Taradale. We did several rotations and learnt

Coding Club

This week a lunchtime coding club started up at school and will be run two lunchtimes a week. Mrs Roydhouse and Mr Jones are running this in Kuaka room and it was great seeing the students turning out on Tuesday to get stuck in to the coding. There are students who are first time coders to some that come with experience. It was neat to see some of the more experienced coders helping those who are just getting started. As a first timer myself it was a challenge, and it was easy to see the benefits of learning this new skill. Creativity, Problem solving and logic thinking skills are at the forefront of this learning.

Writing

As we continue to work with our students and developing their



writing we recently surveyed all of our students to find out how they felt about themselves as writers. Two important aspects for a child to experience success as a writer is to ensure they have choice with their writing and that they are



positive about and feel they are good at writing. Across the school 89% of students feel they have choice with their writing and 87% believe they are good at writing. We are pleased with this result and it gives us some very good baseline information to work with.

Board of Trustees Update

This is the first in what is planned to be a regular update from the Board of Trustees. The intent is to provide snippets from the Board that are hopefully relevant and interesting. Board meetings are open to the public and so are the minutes from these meetings. If you want to know more about the snippets below or anything else about the Board of Trustees, please chat to Tristan or board chair Glen Harkness.

The last meeting of the Board was 9th April.

The School has received confirmation from the Ministry of Education of its funding for the next 5 years to cover property related maintenance and new property related projects. This funding covers things such as building maintenance and painting, and new carpets and air-conditioning. The retaining wall currently being built at school is covered by the previous allocation of funding. However, it does not cover new classrooms. The amount we receive is primarily based on the number of children enrolled at the start of each 5-year period so we have seen a significant increase in this funding round due to the large increase in the school roll over the last 5 years. The Board has begun the required process in partnership with our Ministry approved property manager to develop a plan utilise this funding. Hopefully the bureaucracy moves fast enough so we can share with you in the next newsletter the approved plan.

The board reviewed the school polices related to alcohol following a recent application to sell alcohol at an event, and the expected increase in applications with the completion of the hall project. In all cases events involving alcohol require board approval, however the board has delegated authority to the Principal to approve lower risk applications. The classification of risk is based on those covered in the health and safety polices. A health and safety plan is also required for all events. As a reminder, all of the schools policies can be found at http://eskdale.schooldocs.co.nz

At each meeting the board evaluates progress and performance against seven National Administration Guidelines (NAGs). Most of these are to do with finance, property, employment health and safety etc. However, the curriculum NAG is appropriately NAG 1 and the board received a report from the Principal on the schools Accelerating Achievement Plan. The board was delighted to hear of the wide range of continued as well as new initiatives underway in 2018. Results from previous years show the success of these. Furthermore, the board was happy to hear of the planned and ongoing professional development for the staff involved in Accelerating Achievement initiatives.



POSSUM CONTROL

To Parents and Caregivers

Rural Pest Services Ltd. will be laying poisons for possum control between April 2018 through to September 2018 in the following area, pending appropriate approval and suitable weather conditions.

Project areas cover the following DOC reserves:

Hatuma Conservation Area 100.7ha's Central Hawke's Bay Huranui Scenic Reserves 27ha's Central Hawke's Bay. Mclean's Bush Scenic Reserve 28ha's Central Hawke's Bay. Elsthorpe Scenic Reserves 35ha's Central Hawke's Bay. Tangoio Falls Scenic Reserve 46ha's Tangoio.

Warning notices will be placed on all normal accesses points. Poison areas will remain toxic till all warning notices are removed.

POISONS TO BE USED

<u>CYANIDE</u> pellets, (Feratox) (2-5 pellets, each about 4mm round coloured green) will be put in KK bait stations or bait bag and applied to trees.

Parents please make sure children do not have access to these areas. If they need to go to these areas that they are under strict adult supervision at all times. Because of risk of poisoning from baits and carcasses please keep dogs and other animals under strict control and do not allow animals to wander into or near these areas
