Board of Trustees Update

Notification of Strike

Dear Parents and Caregivers

The NZEI has advised the Eskdale School Board of Trustees that the principal and teachers at our school will be taking strike action on Wednesday 15 August 2018.

The Board has carefully considered the availability of teaching staff and unfortunately decided that we can't provide the normal teaching services or appropriate and safe supervision during the strike. It's important that you make alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children on the day of the strike.

The school will need to close during this strike.

I know that this is inconvenient for parents and students alike, but please be assured that student safety is our main concern.

Rationale for Strike

The claims of the NZEI are listed below. The NZEI has elected to take strike action during their bargaining as they believe the Secretary for Education has not adequately addressed these in the proposed new collective agreement. During collective bargaining, the Secretary for Education takes on some of the roles and responsibilities of the board of trustees as the employer.

NZEI claim	Secretary of Education's offer
 Make sure teachers have time to teach, are well supported to meet the learning needs of all children by: Introducing staffing and resourcing for every school to have a SENCO (Special Needs Coordinator). Doubling the amount of CRT (Classroom Release Time) available to teachers (Currently 10 hours) and renaming it 'professional practice time'. Increase professional leadership staffing to allow more release for teachers in leadership positions. Reduce curriculum staffing ratio to reduce class size and allow for more teachers. Increasing the number of resource teacher positions nationally. 	 Increase CRT to 12 hours per term and rename it as Professional Practice Time. Pro-rata the payment of the unit to part time resource teachers. Change the Tutor Teacher Allowance to a Mentor Teacher allowance and make it available in more circumstances. Enable teachers to take up CoL (Community of Learning) leadership roles.
Address recruitment and retention issues:	
 Increasing pay by 16% increase over the term of CA.(Collective Agreement) 	 3 year term. Differentiated pay increases.

 2 year term. Renewing the salary comparability clauses with secondary teachers. Removing the qualifications cap on the salary scale. Applying increases in the settlement to union members only. 	 Steps 1-7 increase by approx. 14.7% over the 3 year term of the agreement. Steps 8-12 increase by approx. 6.1% over the 3 year term of the agreement. Merge steps 1-4 of the base scale (step 4 is the entry step for teachers with a degree). Renew the salary comparability clause.
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Other Board News

The board received second-term reports for the Targeted Students and the Accelerated Pupil programmes. These results alongside the mid-year report on the attainment of all students against the 'Eskdale Expectation" showed just how well students are achieving and highlight the success of the numerous initiatives being employed by the teachers to drive learning success. Congratulations to both students and teachers on the very pleasing results.

The board reluctantly accepted Sarah Foster's resignation as a parent representative. Sarah has made a considerable contribution to the board and the greater school during her terms on the board. In particular, she held the health and safety portfolio during a period of change in this area brought on by significant changes to legislation. Sarah has also acted as a Board representative during senior staff appointments. The board will shortly formally advertise its intention to fill the vacancy for a parent representative via a process of selection. In the interim, if you wanted to be considered for selection or wanted to know more about what would be involved please feel free to talk to either Tristan or board chair, Glen Harkness

A traffic engineers report commissioned by the Board at the May meeting, confirmed the Boards concerns that the current traffic management, parking situation, especially at drop-off and pick-up times is a health and safety matter. On the basis of this report, a plan to improve parking and pedestrian access to the school will be submitted as part of the schools 5-year plan which is currently due. The board expects to have advice from the Ministry of Education on acceptance of the 5-year plan by the end of 2018. Being a health and safety matter the funds for the parking and pedestrian access would be immediately accessible, therefore the commencement of the project would then be determined by the planning and consent process and securing a contractor.

This term, policies on Complaints, and Behaviour Management are currently up for review and the Board would value your feedback.
