### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

#### August Newsletter

Welcome to the August addition of the school newsletter. This term has certainly started well with the children quickly settling into their learning. I am pleased to be back at school ready to head in to the term ahead. It was great having the opportunity last term to explore what other schools are doing around the country, reflect on our journey as a school, and to have some time travelling with family. All three aspects of what I experienced last term confirmed to me that we are fortunate to live where we do, and the children here at Eskdale benefit from being part of a strong supportive school and community.



**Tough Guy and Gal Challenge:** On Monday the annual tough guy and gal challenge took place at Clifton Station. This year we had a record number of entrants from our school with over 90 children taking on the challenge. They joined with over 1200 students from around the bay to take on the obstacles and the mud. I am always impressed by the grit and determination shown by our children and I wasn't let down yesterday. They all completed the course and most finished with a big smile on their face, which we could usually make out amongst the mud.







**School sports teams:** It is always pleasing seeing how well our teams compete hard but play fair showing excellent sportsmanship. I was lucky enough to see our year 7/8 hockey team play on Friday after school against St Pats and the Eskdale way was certainly on display during that game. I was contacted last week from another school saying how impressed they were by the attitude, commitment, and sportsmanship shown by our students during a netball game.



**House Waiata competition:** The end of term house waiata competition was a huge success with all houses performing to a very high standard. With so many houses performing well in many ways it was sad we had have to have a winner but it is a competition after all. Congratulations to Kauri House who took out first prize this year. The points gained from this event will be added to the overall house competition.

**Sports Fees:** All after school and Saturday morning sports are extra-curricular activities and there are fees associated with these activities. As a school, we pass the registration fee that we are charged for each team on to the players in that team. We have already paid these for term three. Please ensure your account is up to date and all sports fees have been paid as the school cannot carry the costs of your child playing a sport. Thanks

**School Fees/Donations:** Thank you to everyone who has already paid these. The recommended school fees/donation is \$35.00 per term. These form an integral part of ensuring we can provide all of the resources we want for our students. The funds provided by the Ministry of Education do not cover all of the resources we believe are essential for every child to experience success. Over the past 12 months we have used the school donations for increased teachers in classes (reducing teacher to student ratio), increased reading recovery time and bought some robotics, and STEAM resources.

- Individual Child \$140.00 per year.
- Two Children \$280.00 per year.
- Three or more children \$420.00 per year.
