PAT Testing: We have just completed our PAT testing for Mathematics and Reading Comprehension for all students in year's 3 - 8. The PAT tests are a nationally normed and scaled test that give us a gauge on how our learners as a whole are doing when compared to the National norm. (Which is established over a number of years.)

We know individual results can vary as it's a one-off test but the overall picture is what we use to help inform us of our overall programme effectiveness. This year's results were really positive and I am proud of how the students performed particularly when you consider the challenges with Covid-19 in 2020. The other positive aspect when looking at the results broken down by year levels is that our year eight students achieved the best results of any of the current year groups.

Spring greetings from the librarians.




